

This week a local athlete can claim to be the 'Fittest Teenager on Earth' after coming out on top at the CrossFit Games in the USA. Fifteen year-old Lucy McGonigle saw off all competition to win the gold medal at the Alliant Energy Centre in Madison, Wisconsin. Lucy finished second at the

competition 12 months ago but went one step further this time by winning the gold medal.

She developed an interest in CrossFit at a young age, having previously been a dedicated swimmer. She is currently supported by her coach Sam Duckett , who is coach Sam Ducket, who is anticipating further success for Lucy and contemplates that she will someday compete in the Olympics. The 2023 CrossFit Games was the 17th edition of the premier competition in the sport of CrossFit, and Lucy – with 690 points accumulated – is a champion in the 16-17 years girls category.
